4. Number of Competitors Per Team

- 4.1 Each Tribal Council / Team is allowed only two (2) Athletes per event.
- 4.2 Each tribal council can have up to 10 coaches, half of which need to be female.
- 4.3 Alternates. Each team is allowed 2 Male and 2 Female athletes per age category. Should the placement of the alternate become necessary due to injury, illness or absenteeism from the team prior to the commencement of the games being (August 6 scratch meeting), they will be issued numbers. After this meeting, any alternate will be dropped from the roster and only team members can be added to events due to injury or illness, maintain the 4 events/relay as the maximum.
- 4.4 Each Tribal / Grand Council must have a minimum of one female coach and a minimum of one male coach. Managers may be of either gender.
- 4.5 competitors 59 male; 59 female

5.0 Classification

- Bantam (U14) (male & Female) Born 2006/2007
- Midget (U16) (male & Female) Born 2004/2005
- Youth (U18) (male & Female) Born 2002/2003
- Junior (U19) (male & Female) Born 2001

*Athletes cannot move up in athletics and must compete in their respective age divisions. They also cannot compete if born 2008.

6.0 Eligibility

- 6.1 The Tony Cote First Nation Summer Games shall be open to Saskatchewan Residents who are of Status Indian Ancestry. Athlete treaty numbers are required as proof.
- 6.2 All athletes must compete with their respective Tribal/ Grand council teams they are members of.
- 6.3 All athletes must be a member of a First Nation within the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations.
- 6.4 Transfer of Status Indians to another Tribal/Grand council is allowed as per Saskatchewan First Nation Winter and Summer Technical Manual RESIDENCY clause.

7.0 Provincial Registration

1. TEAM REGISTRATIONS

All athletes, coaches and managers must be registered with the *Saskatchewan Athletics Association*

Payment of registration details are listed under 8.3.

Athlete, coach, manager fee: **Total \$200.00 / Team**

Each team is required to complete the attached registration form. This registration form

is to be submitted to the Saskatchewan Athletics Association and the FSIN SCYR

Department no later than **June 14, 2019** (Contact information for both organizations is provided under 2.0).

2. COACH CERTIFICATION

Any staff listed as a coach on the official registration must be fully certified including theory, technical, and practical under the national coaching certification program to – sport coach in athletics or trained in this area. The coach can be Run Jump Throw trained as well. These coaches must have this no later than **June 14, 2019**.

3. PAYMENT OF REGISTRATION

Each Tribal/ Grand Council is responsible to send completed registration forms and payment directly to the *Saskatchewan Athletics Association*

Payment for Team registration fees must be issued on ONE Cheque per Tribal / Grand Council.

Payment and registration are due to the *Saskatchewan Athletics Association* no later than **June 14, 2019** and the total is **\$200.00**.

1. Tribal Councils can have 2 athletes per event. Athletes can only enter 4 events + 1 relay. An athlete running in a relay must be entered in at least 1 other event. A scratch meeting will be held each evening prior to the next day of competition. There will be no add-ins at the Marshaling area or the start line.

10.0 Protest Procedure

1. Sport Protests

The Athletics Canada Rule Book will apply for protests. Protests must be made to the Track Referee. Protests are allowed on rules application only, which will follow the rules of Athletics Canada.

All protests must be dealt with 30 minutes after posted results.

A Sport Jury will consist of Meet Director, FSIN and a Saskatchewan Athletics Technical Director.

2. Eligibility Protests

The FSIN Sport, Culture, Youth and Recreation Board will act as the Jury for all protests dealing with the eligibility of Athletes.

All protests must be communicated to the FSIN Games Coordinator no later than 30 minutes after the posted results.

Protests must be signed by the Team Sport Contact/ Chef-de-Mission or his/her mission staff designate of the participating team. This designate must be submitted in writing.

A fee of \$500.00 will be in place for all protests. This fee will be given directly to the FSIN Games Managers or Technical Director for Athletics. Cash will be the only accepted form of payment. This fee will be put toward the Youth Championships if the protest is lost. Protest fee will be returned if the protest is won by the Team protesting.

11.0 Equipment/ Competitive Uniform

1. Equipment

All track equipment will be supplied at the Canada Games Complex.

2. Competitive Uniform

All athletes must wear their Tribal/ Grand council shirts with the Tribal/Grand Council logo or team name clearly displayed on their shirt. (same color of t-shirt or singlet)

Athletes must wear appropriate shorts such as Russell Athletics Shorts. Jeans and Cut off jeans will not be accepted nor will long style board shorts or swim shorts.

Competition numbers must be worn during all events.

For the events the numbers must be worn: On the Front for X-Country & Long Distance Track Events 800m+ and all Field Events. On the Back for Sprint Events 80m-400m & Relay

3. Uniform Colors

Teams shall select appropriate walk on and competition uniforms adhering to the color schemes approved by the FSIN SCYR Board. The approved color schemes are as follows:
