2019 SASKATCHEWAN FIRST NATIONS SUMMER GAMES

FLYING DUST FIRST NATION

JULY 14-19, 2019

1. Age Divisions for boys and girls
 - 1.1 14U: born in 2005 or 2006, or younger
 - 1.2 16U: born in 2003 or 2004, or younger
 - 1.3 18U: born in 2001 or 2002, or younger

2. Tribal Council Participation: Projected a team in each age division
 - 2.1 26 teams in 14U (13 boys and 13 girls teams) x 5 athletes/team = 130 athletes
 - 2.2 26 teams in 16U (13 boys and 13 girls teams) x 3 athletes/team = 78 athletes
 - 2.3 26 teams in 18U (13 boys and 13 girls teams) x 3 athletes/team = 78 athletes

*New Athletes not registered in another sport only.

3. Competitive Format:
 - 3.1 14U aged athletes to compete in 4 x 4 with 5 members per a team
 - 3.2 16U aged athletes to compete in 2 x 2 with 3 members per team
 - 3.3 18U aged athletes to compete 2 x 2 with 3 members per team

4. Tribal Councils may have:
 - 4.1 One team of 14U boys and one team of 14U girls
 - 4.2 One team of 14U boys and one team of 14U girls
 - 4.3 One team of 14U boys and one team of 14U girls

5. Registration:
 - 5.1 Each Tribal Council completes the FSIN team registration form for each team and submits to Sask Volleyball, along with payment of \$8/athlete.

6. Registration Deadline:
 - 6.1 June 14, 2019

7. Competition Dates:
 - 7.1 July 15-19, 2019

8. Team Check-in and Players Meeting

9. Partner Changes:
 - 9.1 Unlimited substitution of athletes throughout a match.
 - 9.2 Encouragement of all athletes in a team's roster to participate in each match.

10. Seeding of Teams for Tournament:
 - 10.1 Seeding for each Age Division will be conducted by random draw prior to the start of the event, conducted by the Host Committee.

11. Match Format: (subject to change)

- 11.1 First Round will be played in a round robin format
2 games to 21 points, no cap, win by 2
Switch sides at 7th & 14th point of each match
1 time-out/team/set
1 minute between sets
- 11.2 Second Round will be played following re-pooling of teams (if necessary as determined by the draw master)
Best of 3 to 21 points, 3rd set to 15 points, no cap, win by 2
Switch sides at 7th & 14th point of match, 3rd set at 5th and 10th point
1 time-out/team/set
1 minute between sets
- 11.3 Championship Round will be played following Second Round, and involve single-elimination matches.
Best of 3 to 21 points, 3rd set to 15 points, no cap, win by 2
Switch sides at 7th & 14th point of match, 3rd set at 5th and 10th point
1 time-out/team/set
1 minute between sets

12. Schedules

- 12.1 All age groups will play on pre-selected days in morning, afternoon, or evening wave.
- 12.2 Games will start after previous match is completed with a 10 minute warm-up between games.

13. Refereeing:

- 13.1 Round robin: All teams will self call their own match (i.e. ball handling, serves & line faults)
*Note: Good sportsmanship is the rule to be strictly followed. Disputes to be settled by a re-serve with no point gained nor lost, though a Referee Supervisor will be on-site to provide rule clarification.
- 13.2 Re-Pooled Matches: Same as Round-Robin.
- 13.3 Playoff Matches except Gold Medal Matches: Same as Round-Robin.
- 13.4 Gold and Bronze Medal Matches: A Referee will call the match.

14. Referee Supervisors Role:

- 14.1 Ensure matches start on time and good order.
- 14.2 Oversee Round Robin, Re-Pool, and Playoff Matches (except for Gold Medal Matches).
- 14.3 Provide Rule clarification.
- 14.4 Intervene at any time as needed.

15. Upon Completion of each match:

- 15.1 Winners are to return score card and ball to competition desk.

16. Players Uniforms:

- 16.1 Players must wear matching sleeveless shirt and bottoms.
- 16.2 Players are not allowed to play shirtless.
- 16.3 Other items allowed include hats, sunglasses, water bottles, and sand socks.

17. Coaching:

- 17.1 Tribal Councils must name at least one Coach for each gender, who may represent all teams in each Age-Division.
- 17.2 Coaches are encourage to obtain NCCP Level 2 Beach Coach in-training status prior to the start of the games, but there is no requirement to do so.
- 17.3 Coaching is allowed during time-outs, between sets, and prior to and after matches.
- 17.4 Coaching is not allowed during play.

18. Tie Breaking Procedures:

- 18.1 In the first round, if a match is tied after two-sets a one-point tie-breaker will be used to determine the winner of the match. The team that served first in the first set will serve for this point.
- 18.2 For tie-breakers in final standings after the first round and second round the following procedures will be used in order:
 - i. Ratio of Matches Won/Matches Lost (matches between tied teams)
 - ii. Ration of Sets Won/Sets Lost (matches between tied teams)
 - iii. Ration o Sets Won/Sets Lost (all matches)
 - iv. Ration of Points for/against (Matches between tied teams)
 - v. Ration of Points for/against (all matches)
 - vi. As determined by the hosting committee

19. Tournament Committee:

- 19.1 Host Committee Beach Volleyball Chair – Michael Bob
- 19.2 Host Committee Assistant Chair(s) – as confirmed by chair

20. Tournament Committee Authority:

- 20.1 As determined by Host Committee.

21. Duties of Player's Representative:

- 21.1 As determined by Host Committee.

22. Official Beach Volleyball:

- 22.1 Mikasa VLS300

23. Inclement Weather Clause:

- 23.1 The Tournament Committee will suspend play when in their opinion, inclement weather warrants suspension. This decision is solely at the discretion of the Tournament Committee who will determine if and when play is to continue.

24. Venue:

- 24.1 Four outdoor beach volleyball courts during competition Round robin, Re-pooling and Championship matches.
- 24.2 Music to be played during match.

25. Schedule:

25.1 Tournament Draws to be drafted by Sask Volleyball and provided to the Tournament Committee prior to the start of competition.
