- 3.0 DATES** U14 Female – April 12th – April 14th

- 4.0 SANCTIONED** Yes
- 5.0 NUMBER OF COMPETITORS PER TEAM:**
- 5.1 Female Bantam Division 15 players, maximum
Female Midget Division 15 players, maximum
Female Juvenile Division 15 players, maximum
- 5.2 Alternates. Each team may list 3 alternates. Should the placement of the alternate become necessary due to injury, illness or absenteeism the team has until the commencement of the games to slot in the alternate. The maximum number of players will be eligible to be registered participants of the games, issued accreditation and compete shall not exceed 15 players per team.
- 5.3 Each team is allowed to have 2 coaches.
- 5.4 One coach must be female.
- 6.0 CLASSIFICATION (as of Dec 31, 2017)**
- 6.1 Age Categories
Bantam Division (14 & Under) - Born 2006-2007
Midget Division (16 & Under) - Born 2004-2005
Juvenile Division (18 & Under) - Born 2002-2003
- 6.2 The minimum age requirement is 14 years of age (born in 2002)
- 6.3 A player may play one division above their age. Players only play in one division
- 7.0 ELIGIBILITY**
- 7.1 The Saskatchewan First Nation Winter Games shall be open to those who are of Status Indian Ancestry. Athlete treaty numbers are required as proof.
- 7.2 All athletes must play with their respective Tribal/Grand Council teams, in which they are registered as per band membership list.
- 7.3 All athletes must be a member of a First Nation within the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations.

- 7.4 Transfer of status Indians to another Tribal/Grand Council is allowed as per Saskatchewan First Nation Winter and Summer Technical Manual RESIDENCY clause.

8.0 PROVINCIAL REGISTRATION

8.1 Team Registrations

All athletes, coaches and managers are required to complete the attached registration form. This registration form is to be submitted to the Saskatchewan Broomball Association and the FSIN SCYR Department **no later than, March 13th, 2020 at 4:00 pm.**

8.2 Coach Certification

All coaches on the official registration must have Competency Based Education Training system of Broomball for Fun Trained (BF2). These coaches must have this completed **no later than March 13th, 2020.**

All coaches must also take the Respect in Sport Training (RIS), it is an online course that can be completed by registering at the following site and completing the online material: <http://sasksrc.respectgroupinc.com/> . All coaches must be certified **no later than March 13th, 2020.**

8.3 Payment of Registration

Each Tribal/Grand Council is responsible to send completed registration forms and payment directly to the **Saskatchewan Broomball Association.**

Payment for Team registration fees must be issued on ONE cheque per Tribal Council. Payment of \$200.00/per team made payable to **Saskatchewan Broomball Association** **no later than March 13th, 2020.**

9.0 Competition

9.1 Type of Competition

The competition will be a POOL FORMAT.

9.2 Rules Overview

Rules for this event will as per the Saskatchewan Broomball Association rules manual.

- (a) The competition will be non-contact for all categories of play.
- (b) CSA approved hockey helmets with full face masks are required for all players; this includes all players on the bench. Broomball shoes, elbow pads, and shin pads are required as per the SBA rule book. Players will not be allowed to participate without these pieces of equipment. Gloves/hand protection are recommended.

- (c) All protective equipment, except for the gloves and helmet, shall be worn under the uniform.
- (d) Games will consist of two (2) 15 minute stop time periods. If timekeepers are not available, the games will consist of two (2) 18 minute periods with running time. In the case of running time, penalties will be two (2) minutes in length beginning at the time the ball is dropped for the next face off.
- (e) Competition play will begin with Pool play, with a medal round to follow. Each team will be guaranteed 3 games

During pool play, team will be awarded (2) points for a win, (1) points for a tie, (0) for a loss.
- (f) During pool play, games ending in a tie will remain a tie.
- (g) During medal play, games ending in a tie will be:
 - a. the goalie and one player are removed from each team (team's play 4 on 4 with no goaltenders). Defenders are not allowed to be in the crease to make a save or stop a shot from the attacking team. Players must be over half to score in overtime. Teams will play a five (5) minute overtime period – the team with the most goals during this time period will win the game.
 - b. If the game is tied after 5 minutes of overtime, teams will continue 4 on 4 with no goaltenders for another 15 minute sudden death period. The first team to score in this additional period will be declared the winner.
- (h) Teams are allowed one timeout per game.
- (i) Team uniforms must have numbers on them. All players on the same team must wear a different number on their sweaters.
- (j) Teams late for games – clock will start at scheduled game time, after 5 minutes a goal will be added. If a team is not ready to participate after 10 minutes, game will be default 2-0.

10.0 Scoring

Each Tribal/Grand Council will receive points according to the following chart:

11.0 Protest Procedure

11.1 Sports Protest

The Saskatchewan Broomball Association (SBA) Rules Manual will apply regarding protests. Protests must be made to the head referee and he/she can consult FSIN and the Sports Chairperson to make a decision. Protests are allowed on rules applications only, which will follow the rules of Saskatchewan Broomball Association.

The Sport Jury will be comprised of the following members:

- I. Sport Chairperson
- II. Head Referee: Officials involved
- III. SBA Representative
- IV. FSIN Representative

11.2 Eligibility Protests

The FSIN Sport, Culture, Youth and Recreation will act as the Jury for all protests dealing with eligibility of Athletes.

All protests must be concisely written and presented to the FSIN Games Coordinator **immediately after the end of the game**. The Time and date must be submitted in writing. Protests must be signed by the Team Sport Contact/Chef-de-Mission or his/her mission staff designate of the participating team. This designate must be submitted in writing. All protests will be accepted with no explanation from the Board. **All protests must be dealt with within 15 minutes of the game ending** or game stands as posted.

A fee of \$500.00 will be in place for all protests. This fee will be given directly to the FSIN Games Coordinator. Cash will be the only accepted form of payment. This fee will be put toward the Youth Championships if the protest is lost. Protest fee will be returned if the protest is won by the Team protesting.

12.0 Equipment/Competitive Uniform

12.1 Athletic Equipment

All athletes should arrive at the competition venue prepared and equipped to play. All equipment needs to be supplied by the Tribal Council or team involved. (Shoes, Brooms, etc.)

12.2 Competitive Uniforms

It is the coaches and managers of both team responsibility of ensuring that each team wear their Tribal Council team jersey colors/logos. In addition every player must wear helmet, face shield, gloves, neck guard and mouth

guard. Appropriate broomball shoes will only be accepted on the ice and must be inspected by their coaches and managers before the start of the games and deemed acceptable.

13.0 OFFICIATING

13.1 On Ice Officials

Two (2) on ice officials per game when available. Competition will operate with one official is necessary. Officials must be certified by the SBA.

13.2 Off Ice Officials

Minimum of one (1) off ice official per arena (supplied by the host group). When off ice officials are not available at the arena, games will be played with running time as noted in 7.2 Rules Overview.

14.0 Medals

The following medals will be required: Medals for players & 2 coaches

Gold 51 medals

Silver 51 medals

Bronze 51 medals

15.0 MEDICAL SERVICES:

Medical services will be provided by the host society.

A minimum of one First Responder will be on location at all competition times. The First Responder will be equipped with a First Aid Kit.

16.0 SECURITY

A minimum of one security personnel will be on location at all competition times
