

5.2 Alternates. Each team may list 2 alternates. Should the placement of the alternate become necessary due to injury, illness or absenteeism the team has until the commencement of the championships to slot in the alternate. The maximum number of players will be eligible to be registered participants of the championships shall not exceed 12 players.

5.3 Each team is allowed to have 2 coaches and 1 manager registered and sitting on the bench during a match.

5.4 Male teams must have a minimum of 1 male coach. Female teams must have a minimum of 1 female coach.

6.0 CLASSIFICATION

7.0 ELIGIBILITY

7.1 The FSIN Volleyball Championships shall be open to those who are of Status Indian Ancestry. Athlete treaty numbers are requires as proof.

7.2 All athletes must play with their respective First Nation teams, in which they are registered as per band membership list.

7.3 All athletes must be a member of a First Nation within the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations.

8.0 PROVINCIAL REGISTRATION

8.1 Team Registration

All athletes, coaches and managers are required to complete the attached registration form. This registration form is to be submitted to the tournament coordinator **no later than, November 22nd 2019 at 4:00 pm.**

8.2 Coach Certification

All head coaches on the official registration must be certified under the National Coaching Certification Program to a minimum of Development Coach (Level 1) for 14U and 16U and advanced development coach (Level 2) for 18U in Volleyball. Should a head coach not be fully certified development coach, they should obtain the requirements for trained status. (the trained status includes all the components to be development coach certified except the evaluation/practical). These coaches must meet requirements no later than December 13th 2019.

All coaches must be compliant no later than December 13th, 2019.

8.3 Payment of Registration

Entry Fee of \$600 to be paid to Beardy's & Okemasis Cree Nation no later than **November 22nd, 2019.**

(\$500 tournament entry, \$100 sanction fee to Sask Volleyball)

9.0 Competition

9.1 Rules of Play

The 2019 FSIN Youth Volleyball Championships will be subject to the Volleyball Canada Rules for Indoor Volleyball.

12U: Smashbal rules. (See attached)

14U: No overhead reception off the serve. Receiving the serve with an overhand motion using the fingers (setting) is not permitted.

14U: only use Fair Play rule: Everyone needs to start a set.

Substitutions are not permitted in the 1st or 2nd set. (Refer to p. 47 VC Rules) If a player becomes injured/ill, an Exceptional Substitution may be made. The injured/ill player may **not** return to the same set, but may return to play in subsequent sets in the match. We do not allow substitutions after 15 points in sets 1 or 2

14U: only not allowed to play a 5-1 offense if teams choose to, teams will not get penalized.

9.2 Substitution Rule

12U Smashbal rules

14U men: No Libero, 12 sub limited rule

16U women: Libero, 6 sub rule

18U women/men: Libero, 6 sub rule

9.3 Preliminary Competitions

The preliminary competition will consist of a Round Robin with three pools. Seeding for the pools will be determined by draw.

The three pools will be seed based on the serpentine systems as follows:

Pool A: 1, 6, 7,12, Pool B: 2, 5, 8, 11 Pool C: 3, 4, 9, 10

POOL A	POOL B	POOL C

With the first round complete the teams will then re-pooled for Round Robin Play, if necessary, as determined by the scheduler. A power-pool system will be considered as appropriate.

The draw and schedule for the 2019 Youth FSIN Volleyball Championships will be completed by Sask Volleyball in conjunction with the 2019 Championship Coordinator.

Pool ranking shall be determined according to the current (2019-20) Indoor Volleyball Rule Book.

9.4 Championship Round

After completing the Re-pool, some or all of the team will move on to the championship round. Not all teams will be guaranteed a minimum of 1 game in the championship round. Medals will be given to the top three teams in the championship round.

10.0 Scoring

10.1 Match Play

Each team will play one match against all the other teams in its pool. The round robin will be played best 2 of 3 sets to 25 points (win by 2). Deciding set will be played to 15 points (win by 2).

10.2 Tie Breaking Rule

Ties will be broken according to the 2019-20 Volleyball Canada Indoor Rule Book

11.0 Protest Procedure

11.1 Sports Protest

The Volleyball Canada rules for Indoor Volleyball will apply regarding protests. Protests must be made to the head referee and he/she can consult the Championship Committee to make a decision. Protests are allowed on rules applications only, which will follow the rules of Sask Volleyball.

The Sport Jury will be comprised of the following members:

- I. Championship Chairperson
- II. Head Referee: Officials involved
- III. FSIN Representative

11.2 Eligibility Protests

The Championship Committee will act as the Jury for all protests dealing with eligibility of Athletes.

All protests must be concisely written and presented to the Championship Coordinator immediately at the end of the game. The Time and date must be submitted in writing.

All protests will be accepted with no explanation from the Board. All protests must be dealt with within 15 minutes of the game ending or game stands as posted.

A fee of \$200.00 will be in place for all protests. This fee will be given directly to the Championship Coordinator. Cash will be the only accepted form of payment. This fee is non refundable and will be put toward the Youth Championships.

12.0 Equipment/Competitive Uniform

12.1 Competitive Uniform

It is the coaches and managers of both teams responsibility of ensuring that all their athletes wear appropriate clothing (such as a jersey and Russell Athletics shorts) before the start of the game. All jersey requirements as set by the Volleyball Canada stipulate that jerseys may only be number 1-99. Numbers should be visible on the front and back of the jersey. Clean indoor shoes will only be acceptable on the court floors and must be inspected by their coaches and managers before the start of the game and deemed

acceptable. No jewelry allowed on the court during games, unless it is completely covered by tape.

12.2 Equipment

The official ball will be the Mikasa VUL500 for 14U female, MIP300 for 14-16U male and 16-18U female, and MVA200 for 18U male.

Net Heights:

Under 14 women: 2.15m

Under 14 Men: 2.20m

Under 16 women: 2.20m

Under 16 Men: 2.35m

Under 18 women: 2.24m

Under 18 Men: 2.43m

13.0 Referees/Volunteers

13.1 Referees must be sanctioned for use through the Sask Volleyball. All referees must be registered Referees with the Sask Volleyball. All round robin and re-pool games will utilize one head referee. All championship and consolation matches will have both a head referee and a second referee (pending availability of referees)

13.2 Minor officials for scorekeeping will be supplied by host.

13.3 Teams will be required to provide lines keeping duty during the match.

12U Tournament Play

Smashbal is a:

- volleyball **game-play variation** that emphasizes attacking (hitting/spiking).

How is Smashbal played?

- off of an ATTACK - the receiving team can **catch** the ball directly, OR after the ball bounces **once**, and still continue the rally. (NO POINT IN SCORED)
- off of a SERVED or TOSSED ball - the receiving team must catch/play the ball directly (no bounce).

NOTE:

Setters may choose to use a:

- CATCH & TOSS for ball movement ('passing') to the hitter, OR
- SELF-TOSS & VOLLEY

Serve alternates between teams after every point (2019 rule)

No Blocking allowed

Tournament Format:

Based on Volleyball Canada Rules, if two or more teams are tied at the end of round robin play, the following criteria will be applied in order:

- a) The team having the best ratio of **won/lost matches**, considering matches **between tied teams**, will be ranked higher;
- b) The team having the best ratio of **points for/against**, considering games played **between tied teams**, will be ranked higher;
- c) The team having the best ratio of **points for/against**, considering **all games played during the round**, will be ranked higher;
- d) As determined by the Organizing Committee (e.g. extra game, toss of coin, etc.)

Match Preparation:

- Please have your team ready to play on time. Once all teams have played one match, you will have only a **five-minute ball warm up** on court before the start of your next match.
- All games shall start on time as scheduled. Failure of a team to be ready to play at the scheduled time will be penalized by awarding the opponent 15 points. A further 10 minutes will be allowed before the forfeiture of the match.
- Teams must supply their own warm up balls.

Tournament organization:

Game play format: Smashbal

Team composition: 6 – 8 players / team

Matches played 3 v 3

2 Smashbal courts / volleyball court (*Volleyball court divided in half, lengthwise*)

No referees - Teams call their own net faults;
- Teams make their own line calls

Scorekeeping -

Each team must provide 1 scorekeeper per match. These players are still eligible to play and may be substituted in to play at the end of the set.

Teams may wish to have parent volunteers take care of this duty for your team.

Score table - flip cards at each court

Score table - record sheet to summarize the scores for Pool play and Re-Pool play

Round Robin Pools -

Format: *'Passes between teammates': Toss – Self-toss & Volley – Attack*

- Timed matches 30 minutes / match
 - This includes warm-up and movement between benches @ halfway point
 - 5 minutes/set; 4 sets/match
 - Fair Play: Each team will be divided into 2 groups
The group 'on the bench' for a set, will start in the following set
